there is some controversy in this because only a female was found and details of male genitalia only are reliable; however this female was outside

the size range for M. sexnotatus and within the M. cristatus size range. The latter is more frequent on cereal crops such as

oats. Further sampling is required to find males of these species at this site. One further problem is that the translation of the German trivial name is 'Comb Migrant leaf-hopper', which hardly seems relevant to its habit
